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Mr. Rakestraw, if permitted by a care provider, could be treated with a therapeutic dosing schedule of a proprietary nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medication such as Celebrex or Mobic. The cost of such a medication used in a therapeutic dosing schedule would be approximately \$60.00 to \$75.00 per month. Long term use of a therapeutic dosing schedule of a proprietary nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medication should be supervised by a care provider for possible deleterious side effects which can occur affecting the kidneys, liver, and/or gastrointestinal tract. Quarterly office visits and laboratory assessments are needed in such circumstances. The cost of such management would be approximately \$700.00 per year. Such management should be continued as long as the use of a therapeutic dosing schedule of a proprietary nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medication does reduce the pain and discomfort due to the right foot metatarsalgia.

The use of a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medication is a possibility although the severity of Mr. Rakestraw's diabetes mellitus may preclude using such a medication particularly in a therapeutic dosing schedule.


I believe Mr. Rakestraw's condition is stable. His prognosis is guarded.
